Lisa Stinson earned her MFA in Ceramics from Rhode Island School of Design, a BFA in Ceramics from New York College of Ceramics at Alfred University and a BA in Psychology from Wells College. She exhibits her work nationally, and has lectured at conferences, led numerous workshops in both ceramic practices and kiln building techniques and design. She is also a Professor of Art at Appalachian State University.

Stinson's ceramic work whether functional or sculptural provide a space for connecting ideas. The relationships between forms, surfaces and color enables insight though both individual expressions and considered groupings. Meaning is nurtured through the ongoing dialogue of the makers touch and the viewers contemplations.

Her works explore mark making, as it relates to surface, pattern, drawing and the rhythms of abstraction. The continued commitment to materials and glaze research has enabled Lisa to utilize her extensive in-depth knowledge to expand her making vocabulary, firing methods and a wide variety of surface techniques.
